Chief Waugh announced that it is an exciting time for the Fire Department and the reason is because we have not had a Captain in the Department in over 20 years. He stated so it is exciting to open this position back up and they could not have found a better person for this position. He asked everyone to look around and notice that there were not only Firefighters from our Department but from East Cleveland, University Heights and Cuyahoga. He added that there are also Fire Chiefs, such as the Bedford Chief and one that is here by default.

He stated it is Chief Vedder but he will let Lieutenant Vedder introduce him. He asked that Lieutenant Vedder come up.
