**REGULAR MEETING MINUTES JUNE 18, 2019**

**Departmental Reports:** Mayor Sellers stated that Council should have a copy of the Departmental Reports in their possession. He stated that if they have any questions to please reach out to the individual Director. He stated that if they have additional questions, they can contact the Office of the Mayor as well for further discussion.

### **Guest Speakers**

Eric Stubbs and Willie Brown from the Cuyahoga County Board of Elections discussed the consolidation of the polling place to the Athletic Center at the high school. Mr. Stubbs stated this is due to the closure of Eastwood, John Dewey and the middle school within the next two years along with the issues at the Senior & Civic Center. Mr. Stubbs recommended starting the change early in order to prepare for the next two years. He stated this move will prepare us for the next 15-20 years and that any other move would be an adjustment over a 2 or 3 year time frame. He stated to stabilize the community and enhance the voter engagement process is "the why." He remarked "the how" is to send the voters two notices: one after the move and one before the election but they anticipate the participation of the City in getting the word out. He stated that they have recruited Dawn Hodge who will be the Senior Rover in this community to monitor the issue at the new voting location. He explained that the Board of Elections will be

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responsible for the parking attendants and there will be two people assigned to the lot all day. He commented that they have the stats in their possession as well as the proposal map.

**Mayor Sellers** clarified that it is the Board of Elections' recommendation that the polling place be consolidated to the Athletic Center portion of the high school. He stated starting this November, all residents will be led to voting at this location because Eastwood, John Dewey and the middle school will be going away. He commented that the intent is for Board of Elections to reanalyze the one location once solid locations are back up because that is a lot of people.

**Mr. Stubbs** commented it represents 9,000 registered voters and gave an example of Bedford Heights now being in a consolidated location as well as Parma Heights with 12,000 residents. He remarked that they currently have the process down to a science. He commented there will be 50 election officials on site as they have put the resources in place to keep the flow going.

**Councilwoman Hagwood** asked how many voting booths there will be at the consolidated location and how are they broken down by ward.

**Mr. Stubbs** replied the number of voting booths are determined by the statute of 1 for every 75 registered voters. He reported that he has 56 assigned to this location based on the number of registered voters and there will be 8 check-in stations.

**Councilwoman Hagwood** stated that she has always been concerned about Warrensville Heights residents being giving preference to working at our polls.

**Mr. Stubbs** stated that they utilize Ms. Hodge and she will be assigned to the Warrensville area. He responded that he is waiting on a response back from one of the elected officials that may be present. **Mr. Stubbs** stated that goes back to the Poll Worker Department about her residents volunteering but it is the recruitment side so if it is on the website and they sign-up, their participation should not be a problem.

**Economic Development Manager Raymon Turner** expressed concern with the wait time to vote given the large population of seniors in the community.

**Mr. Stubbs** replied that Council has been provided a packet of how the flow will work. He commented that residents that are handicapped or seniors have a section that is no more than 15 feet from the door.

**Mr. Brown** added that over the past couple years, the Board of Election has used electronic poll books which has helped the flow of residents coming in to vote.

**Mayor Sellers** asked about the success of their consolidated locations during the last presidential election.

**Mr. Stubbs** stated that they consider seven of their precincts to be consolidated and they have been that way for just past two years.

**Mayor Sellers** commented that the concern in more of a presidential election than a primary and next November there will be quite a turnout.

**Mr. Stubbs** stated due to the setup at the high school, no one will have to stand outside and the electronic booking will help the process go a lot faster. He stated they are prepared for an aggressive turnout. He commented that there will be 48 slots.

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**Councilman Howard** commented that he spoke to Mr. Stubbs and Mayor Booker in Highland Hills reached out to him as well to speak at the Democratic Tri-City Club meeting on July 9, 2019 to have a more in depth discussion about the transition. He stated hopefully they can solidify the date and that our constituents may have some concerns to address.

**Council President Mitchell** inquired if the School District is a partner and on line with everything the Board of Election wants to do.

**Mr. Stubbs** responded yes, they are. He stated they have not been notified via permit yet but that is the process after confirmation from the Mayor.

**Residents' Requests and Comments:**

**Ed Chambers** commented that he is sure the change in polling location will not be a big problem for residents but that is not why he is here tonight. He stated that there was a concrete job done to his home two or three years ago under the Home Improvement Program. He stated that when the job was completed he informed the contractor that the calculations or mixture was wrong after seeing yellow spots. He stated he asked the contractor what his mixture was and he responded it was 6.5 which is incorrect. He made a suggestion to add to the manual what the mix should be for contractors.

**Building Commissioner Ben Brown** reported that our ordinance states that they may suggest concrete specifications but generally that is requested when there are special orders such as MS concrete or fiber mesh. He stated he took a look at Mr. Chambers's driveway, contacted the concrete company about the 2016 job and is waiting for a response. He stated that there is always a pre-pour inspection.

**Mayor Sellers** stated with the Exterior Grant Maintenance Program, you get to select your own contractor. He remarked that a contractor can tell you that they are using a specific mixture but could be pouring something different but you'll see the result in the end. He commented if it was a bigger job, they would make the company pour a cylinder but for smaller jobs, the City is relying on the company to do it correctly. He suggested having some kind of reciprocity when the job is faulty.

**Councilwoman Hagwood** stated she has shared privately and publically that she has been requesting a Building Committee meeting since February and one of the items was to discuss the expectations of a contractor. She acknowledged that Councilman Howard attempted once to put a meeting together. She commented that Mr. Chambers could have spoken more about his situation. She stated that it is HER lane because she is a legislator and the Building Department has their own matters and they could have benefited from having a legislative meeting and discussing various issues.

**Lewis Brownlowe** stated he has been a resident for 39 years and represents the Clarkwood Granada Tenant Association. He stated they were her last month to express their concerns about the police presence in the neighborhood. He commented that the Mayor gave the Association his word that he would personally take care of the matter. He thanked the Mayor

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for keeping his word because after the meeting he did notice immediate police presence. He thanked Police Chief Haynes as well. He stated he has been told that there has been a decrease of that presence over the last week. He remarked the Association urges them to maintain the police presence. He added that it would be beneficial to have a car parked on Granada Garden Boulevard because there are speeders.

**Mayor Sellers** thanked Mr. Brownlowe and informed him that they have not decreased the police presence. He stated that he created a whole new zone with Clarkwood but the police are not just sitting; they move in the zone. He shared that due to the comments about people at night he positioned himself in the area at 11:30p.m. to observe. He commented that some of the poles are so antiquated and now they cannot "throw enough light to save Jesus!" He reported that one of the problems is that there are no lights over there. He stated the Building Department is setting up a meeting with AIY to address that issue; it is a combination of the patrolling as well as the enhancements that need to be made on the property.

**Mr. Brownlowe** reported that there is a meeting with AIY tomorrow with the Tenant Association and it is their intention to hold their feet to the fire.

**Lily Belvy-Holt** stated she is looking for a firm date when the dumpsters are going to be moved back to the regular spot.

**Service Director Ted Sims** replied that the order has been put in and it is supposed to be this week. He stated he will get with her tomorrow and let her know for sure.

**Mayor Sellers** explained there were some dumpsters moved in Banbury from the back of the property to the front and the residents want them back. He stated they went out there in the Spring with the trash collector, Kimble to look at the locations. He stated Kimble was to give them a number of relocations for these dumpsters and place the order with them.

**Mr. Sims** explained that all the containers are going to be moved back to where they were except the one where the wires were an issue.

**Ms. Belvy-Holt** stated that is where she lives and she is concerned where the dumpster is going to be.

**Mr. Sims** responded that they will go and look around to see exactly where to put it and what Kimble is discussing is pull it back away from the wires, lift it up, dump it and push it back.

**Ms. Belvy-Holy** commented that they have been doing that for the 45 years she has lived there so she does not understand the problem now.

**Mayor Sellers** stated for 45 years we were not lifting trash cans over the top. He explained Ms. Belvy-Holt lives in an apartment where the dumpster is in a parking lot where cars are parked on both sides of the alley. He explained that the overhead wiring has led to them dragging the can back to an opening but Kimble is concerned because there are cars that could be damaged if the can gets away. He stated there is going to have to be a meeting of the minds for this issue.

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**Ms. Belvy-Holt** responded that is fine and that they will talk.

**Mr. Sims** stated the order was put in last week and he will talk to Kimble in the morning.

**Mayor Sellers** asked what is going to happen with the pads that they poured up front.

**Ms. Belvy-Holt** answered that she does not know, that it is another problem and that Mr. Sims created it!

**Mr. Sims** responded that he will look in to getting the pads taken care of.

**Ms. Belvy-Holt** thanked Mr. Sims.

**Fire Chief Herb Waugh** wished everyone a good evening. **Councilman Anderson** wished everyone a good evening. He congratulated Lieutenant Petti for his promotion and Fireman James Hrib for his retirement.

**Councilwoman White** thanked everyone for coming out and asked if there is a date for the School Supply Drive.

**Superintendent Jolly** reported that it is August 3<sup>rd</sup> 11:00a.m. - 2:00p.m.

**Councilwoman White** announced the Wards 1, 2 and 3 Party in the Park event at Ridgewood Park from noon - 4:00p.m.

**Councilman Stewart** acknowledged Louis Brownlowe, one of the founders of the Granada Gardens Tenant Association and the very conscientious and concerned residents in Ward 4. He announced the Tenant Association meeting will be tomorrow and attend if you can as it will be very informative and very, very intense.

**Councilwoman Hagwood** thanked everyone for attending the meeting.

**Director Teresa Beasley** had nothing to report.

**Council President's Comments**

**Council President Mitchell** commented that it is not raining and they are here! She thanked everyone for attending. She shared that tomorrow is an interesting day in history; 156 years ago in 1863, the last people found out they were emancipated and it is called Juneteenth. She shared there are celebrations in 48 states and it is something we should really think about and

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celebrate. She stated people also called it the Freedom Day. She shared that 109 years ago was the first Father's Day. She remarked to our wonderful fathers, Father's Day is everyday so Happy Belated Father's Day. Council President thanked Mr. Brown and Mr. Sims for addressing local resident concerns. She reported that on her way here at the corner of Longbrook and Warrensville Center Road, she smelled gas and called Fire Chief Waugh. She reported he immediately got a team over there and it was a natural gas leak and was able to get the gas department there within minutes.

**Mayor's Comments**

**Mayor Sellers** thanked everyone for coming out. He congratulated new Lieutenant Petti and thanked Firefighter Hrib for his service to this community. He recognized the Civil Service Commission members, Mr. White, Ms. Rudolph and Ms. Tullos for their hard work. He thanked the residents from Granada, Mr. Brownlowe in particular. He announced that he and his staff have been in contact with the City of Cleveland for the residents in Cinema Park about Cleveland water. Mayor Sellers stated they are supposed to come out and do some flushing of the lines if it has not started already. He stated that he wants residents to take advantage of Shred Day on Saturday so if you have old tax records, textbooks and documents you do not feel safe putting in the trash, you can bring that to Green Road Park; the service is free. He announced that the City Fireworks are June 30<sup>th</sup> this year and we should be the first municipality in the county doing fireworks this year. He thanked School Board President Traci Mitchell, Vice President Ray Freeman, and Superintendent Jolly for their continued cooperation in allowing us to use the facility for the event. He announced that the Rain Date is July 1<sup>st</sup>. He wished all fathers a Happy Belated Father's Day and everyone a good evening.
